July 5, 2011 City Council Meeting

**Shut off Notices-** The Utilities Department hung 43 Shut off notices on customer doors June 28, 2011, as mentioned before many of these accounts will be brought current prior to discontinuing service.

**Water Rate Study-** Staff met with Mr. Josh Eggleston, RCAP on Wednesday June 22 to discuss Water Department finances. Additional information was requested by Mr. Eggleston and it was determined that it would not be available until end of June. It was agreed that this data would be forwarded to him by July 8, 2011.

**Road Maintenance-** The Street Department put down 33 tons of hand patch asphalt over the past two weeks. Staff continues to evaluate the maintenance needs of road surfaces throughout the City for 2011.

**Ditching-** Several hundred feet of ditching was completed along Dan and Pauli St. to improve drainage to the storm sewers. Residents were very appreciative of this work. Street Supt. Petersen should be commended for his communications with the property owners in completing work that can be very controversial.

**Yard Waste-** The Street Department has been kept busy loading and processing recycle yard waste materials this spring. This has become a daily task due to the sheer amount of waste that is delivered to our yard. We are filling a 20 cu yd. container daily, that is about four single axel dump truck loads daily..

**Maintenance Mechanic-** Staff has interviewed the top candidates following Civil Service protocol to fill the subject position and will be making a recommendation for hire as soon as possible. The successful candidate must have reference checked as well as a background check through the Canal Fulton Police Department. This action will take place upon the return of the City Manager Asst. from vacation.

**Part Time Utility Workers-** Staff has interviewed seven (7) potential candidates as of this writing for the subject positions. There is one additional interview scheduled on this date. It is felt a recommendation can be made to the City Manager next week. A reference check as well as a background check through the Canal Fulton Police will be completed prior to hire.

**Municipal Staff-** It is commendable that through the efforts of all City Departments working independently and together that the facilities to accommodate an event like Old Canal Days are made possible while all other City Services flow as usual. It is also a wonderful thing to live in and be part of a community that has the volunteers such as the Old Canal Days Festival Committee that makes this event possible. I want to thank you all.

**Did you know that for ice control the street department limits salt application to 200 pounds per lane mile per pass.**



# YTD Income Tax Collections as of June 30



## *From the Office of the City Manager*

### City Manager's Report of July 5, 2011

1. Buck Chevrolet Plaza – We've been in communication with Dan Buck concerning the condition of and potential uses for his plaza at the end of Poplar Street overlooking the canal. He has agreed to pay for any improvements that we make which have included painting the railing and repairing a light fixture. He is permitting the city to provide a bicycle parking area with a rack and signage. John Murphy and the Mayor's Student Works staff have cleaned it up performed most of the painting. The bicycle rack was donated by Bell Stores.

2. Pavement Management Study – We met with representatives from CCI Engineering concerning the creation and implementation of a pavement assessment and management program. The building information modeling that CCI has proposed will provide us with three dimensional plans that can be easily accessed and updated. This would save us time in planning projects, reduce the need for change orders, and avoid potential conflicts as we maintain and improve our streets. CCI has offered to use Canal Fulton as a pilot for this study at no cost to us. Councilman Matt Moellendick should be commended for bringing this opportunity to us. He will be submitting a proposal.

3. Business Assistance Recruitment Calculator – Mayor Grogan has authorized me to move forward with making our webpage more business friendly with the creation of a business assistance recruitment calculator. Prospective businesses will soon be able to log on to our website and click on a link that will take them to a page similar to what's in this report. By entering data such as meter size, estimated water usage and income, and property valuation one can estimate taxes and utilities in the city. Keep in mind the school income tax is only assessed on those living in the city. CDJ Consulting is creating this for us.



## *From the Office of the City Manager*

### **City Manager's Report of June 21, 2011**

1. Ryan Trewin Sign at Locust/Cherry – City Engineer Bill Dorman is going to review the sign plan and advise Council on the Locust/Cherry intersection project's impact on the sign's location.
2. Marshallville Sanitary Sewer – The Ohio EPA has contracted with a consultant to conduct a site visit to review the project or final completion. They will be here on July 14<sup>th</sup>.
3. The City has received requests from several downtown merchants to install bike racks. Mayor Grogan has authorized me to order two racks, photo attached. I will work with Service Director and Streets Supt to identify ideal placement of the racks.



4. Downtown Parking Committee – After researching past plans, reviewing area properties, and receiving input from downtown merchants, we have established some short-term solutions to improve parking for Canal Street.

- a. Re-evaluate location of the 2-hour parking signage and remove them from street sections where longer term parking may be advantageous.
- b. Establish public parking along the wharf between the Century House and the wharf entrance.
- c. Improve directional signage and mark designated street parking spaces.
- d. Work with the Heritage Society to develop more parking behind the Blank House.
- e. Establish angle parking on the south side of Walnut while maintain 2-way traffic.
- f. Leasing the Hatfield lot alleviates the current parking issues though it would be advantageous for the city to eventually own the parking lot.

5. Mechanic interviews will be conducted on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. Four individuals passed the civil service exam.

6. Our OECA letter of inquiry for a grant for the mural was submitted but federal funding for OECA grants has been put on hold. No OECA FY2011 projects have received funding yet this year.



## A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE STATE OF OHIO FROM SEEKING TO TAKE CONTROL OF MUNICIPAL TAX COLLECTION.

WHEREAS, during the recent discussion regarding the State Biennial Budget Bill (HB 153) it was suggested that the Ohio Department of Taxation take over the collection of municipal income taxes; and

WHEREAS, although the current pending legislation does not contain any provision for the State to take control of municipal income taxes, the legislation may be amended before final consideration in June; and

WHEREAS, income tax is the largest source of revenue for most municipalities and any disruption or interference with the current collection process will be harmful to the financial operations; and

WHEREAS, in the wake of sweeping reductions in the Local Government Fund, municipalities cannot afford another potential loss in revenue; and

WHEREAS, through the local administration of municipal income tax collections, the City is able to provide exemplary customer service including, but not limited to walk-up assistance preparing individual income tax returns; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANAL FULTON, OHIO, THAT:

**Section 1:** This Council does hereby declare its strong opposition to any effort by the State of Ohio to take over the collection of municipal income taxes in Ohio; and urges its state legislators to reject and oppose any amendment to pending bills or introduction of new legislation that proposes to transfer collection and/or control of municipal income taxes to the State of Ohio Department of Taxation.




