The St. Helena II was constructed from 1967 to 1970 through the hard work and efforts of many Stark County businesses, organizations and volunteers. Local enthusiasts and community volunteers donated hundreds of hours to build this replica of a Three-Cabin Freight boat. She was the first authentically built canal boat of her kind to ply the waters of the Ohio & Erie Canal since the end of the canal era. Operating from 1970 to 1988, thousands upon thousands of visitors enjoyed a leisurely ride along the historic canal. Her legacy has been carried on in the St. Helena III which continues to provide education, relaxation and tourism to Canal Fulton.

After retirement, the St Helena II was saved from languishing in the canal by another group of enthusiasts. She was pulled from the canal, fixed up and currently sits as a museum exhibit.

Soon, she will once again educate visitors and offer a glimpse into yester-year. Since her inception, she has served as an example of not only the accomplishments of our ancestors but also the resourcefulness, dedicated community spirit and pride of Stark County and Canal Fulton.
